The Allegheny College Association, in conjunction with Allegheny College, offers a limited number of scholarships for part-time enrollment at the college. The ACA Scholarship was established to provide an opportunity for women who have been out of the classroom for a number of years to continue their education.

Each Scholarship includes:

- tuition for a maximum of 12 credits for the 2009-2010 academic year
- a stipend each semester to cover related expenses

The Scholarships are open to women, age 25 or over, who are residents of Crawford County at the time of application. Applicants must have completed high school or the equivalent and have completed no more than two years of college.

Preference will be given to applicants who have realistic educational goals and the potential for academic success.

Applicants will be interviewed in March and the awards announced shortly thereafter. Because employees of Allegheny College are eligible for tuition remission under another program, employees of Allegheny College are ineligible for this scholarship.

As you consider applying for this scholarship, the information about Allegheny College that follows could be important to you. It is very briefly stated, but if you would like to discuss any of these points in more detail, please feel free to call Rebecca Wiler at 332-3101 or Tami Lakins at 332-2957.

1. The academic calendar consists of two semesters, each 14 weeks long. Full time students generally take four courses per semester. For each course completed, they typically receive four semester hours. 131 semester hours are required for graduation.
2. The course offerings are strictly liberal arts: very few courses are directly job-related; there are no vocational-technical courses.
3. Some courses have prerequisites (listed in the Allegheny College catalogue).
4. There are no "life experience" credits granted.
5. The scholarship recipient will have an advisor from the faculty to help in course selection as well as other areas. The recipient will be classified as a degree-seeking student and all courses taken will count toward a degree should she decide to continue here or elsewhere.
6. The recipient will have all student privileges, including: bookstore, library, fitness center, computing and parking.
